The award ceremony was attended by inmates and senior jail officials from Uttar Pradesh.









- Awards for Jail Staff






Ajay from Central Jail, Bilaspur, **Chhattisgarh** was given first prize for depicting the presence of radio in jail,



• 35-year-old **Kamlesh** is lodged in **Firozabad District Jail**. She gives exemplary support to her fellow women inmates in their times of illness and need. Her selflessness in their service is of such high order that without waiting for the staff, she unhesitatingly cleans the toilets.

• Charan Singh lodged in Central Jail, Alwar, Rajasthan, was working as sub-inspector in CRPF before coming to jail. He has helped the prison system by helping inmates to use the jail calling system. Due to his initiative, more than 700 inmates are using STD on a regular basis to stay connected with their family members.


